SUMMARY: The AIROPS, who is ground based, is primarily responsible for preparing the air operations portion of the Incident Action Plan (IAP). After the plan is approved, the AIROPS is responsible for implementing its strategic aspects, which are those that relate to the overall incident strategy, and to some extent supervise tactical operations. Further detail on these duties are provided in the Incident Management Handbook.
